
Now, a paper bag might not be the first item of clothing you would expect to see a princess wearing, but in KS1's new literacy unit, it is precisely all this sorrowful princess has left to wear, after a firebreathing dragon destroys everything in sight! In preparation for writing their own 'defeating a monster' story, the children have immersed themselves in the rich story language, through role play and creating an illustrated story map, of The Paper Bag Princess text. To embed the story vocabulary further, the children have also devised a set of actions to match key phrases from the story. Explain to someone at home how these actions help you to remember the story language, for your own writing.






Discussing the punchy headlines of 'Man on the Moon!' or 'Moon Landing!' has been keeping KS2 pupils busy in their newspaper report writing unit this week. Like bees collecting their honey, the children have successfully collaborated, to create their own newspaper reports, based on the historical moon landing events. Selecting which report features give the greatest impact to the reader, the pupils have made considered choices to present their news. Using a pupil generated success criteria for the key features of a newspaper report, the children took turns to assess each report, and be critical friends with their constructive feedback. Which newspaper feature pulls the reader in the most, and why?

Being able to teach what you have learnt to others shows a deeper and secure understanding of your own learning, and the children in KS2 proved they were deserving of the green traffic light yet again, in their pupil self-assessment, when they presented their newspaper report work to KS1. It was tremendous to see and hear the effort made to share their learning with their younger peers, and it is fast becoming a favourite part of the learning for KS1 and KS2!
