

Farway Church of England Primary School

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Dear Parents,

Using their Owl learning powers this week, the children at Farway have been carefully noticing and observing, in all their learning. The children have been reminding themselves of the animal learning powers we use at Farway to help us focus our learning.

Hot seating the characters of the Little Red Hen has helped the children in KS1 to deepen their knowledge of this traditional tale, and use their questioning skills and language. Discussing how the Little Red Hen might have felt when her friends didn't help her, has also helped the children to begin to empathise with a story character, and relate this to their own lives and friendships at school or home. The children have also started using some story writing language such as, 'Opening' and 'Ending' to identify what happened in different parts of the familiar tale, and sequence images and story text to correctly order the story events. In maths, the children have been learning their number bonds and thinking of creative ways to help them remember the numbers to make 10 or 20. They have used actions and rhyme to embed their number facts. Maybe the children can teach someone at home the actions, for the number bonds to make 10! 2 and 8 are always... 5 and 5 like to...

Fresh from their exciting and insightful trip to Tiverton Museum last week, the pupils in KS2 continue to have taken a step back in time. They have been introduced to Maggie, a little girl from the Victorian times who has started to write her own diary of her trials and tribulations during this era. Focusing on verbs, adverbs and fronted adverbials in their Victorian diary writing this week, KS2 have discussed the effectiveness and position of these word classes in a sentence, and applied their knowledge to their own detailed diary writing. In maths, the pupils have excelled in the challenge and fun of using larger numbers, as they work towards the end of their Place Value unit. By physically 'building' the larger numbers and noticing the value of each digit within these larger numbers, the children have developed their understanding and progressed to adding and subtracting, with 2, 3, 4 and more digit numbers. Perhaps the children can explain to someone at home, the importance of placing 0 in a number such as 4062 and what difference it would make if it wasn't there to 'hold the place'?

Many thanks to all who contributed to our wonderful Harvest celebrations last weekend. It was once again an annual highlight, so a big thankyou to those who attended. It was Reverend Peter's last service at Farway Church but he did also lead our school worship on Thursday when we presented him with a card that the children had made. I would like to thank Reverend Peter for all the support he has given to me and to the school during his time in Farway.

Outdoor clothing and P.E Kit

All children need to have appropriate outdoor clothing with them for every Wednesday afternoon. The children also need to have the full P.E kit in school every Monday, consisting of red Farway logo t-shirt, black shorts and trainers. Thank you.

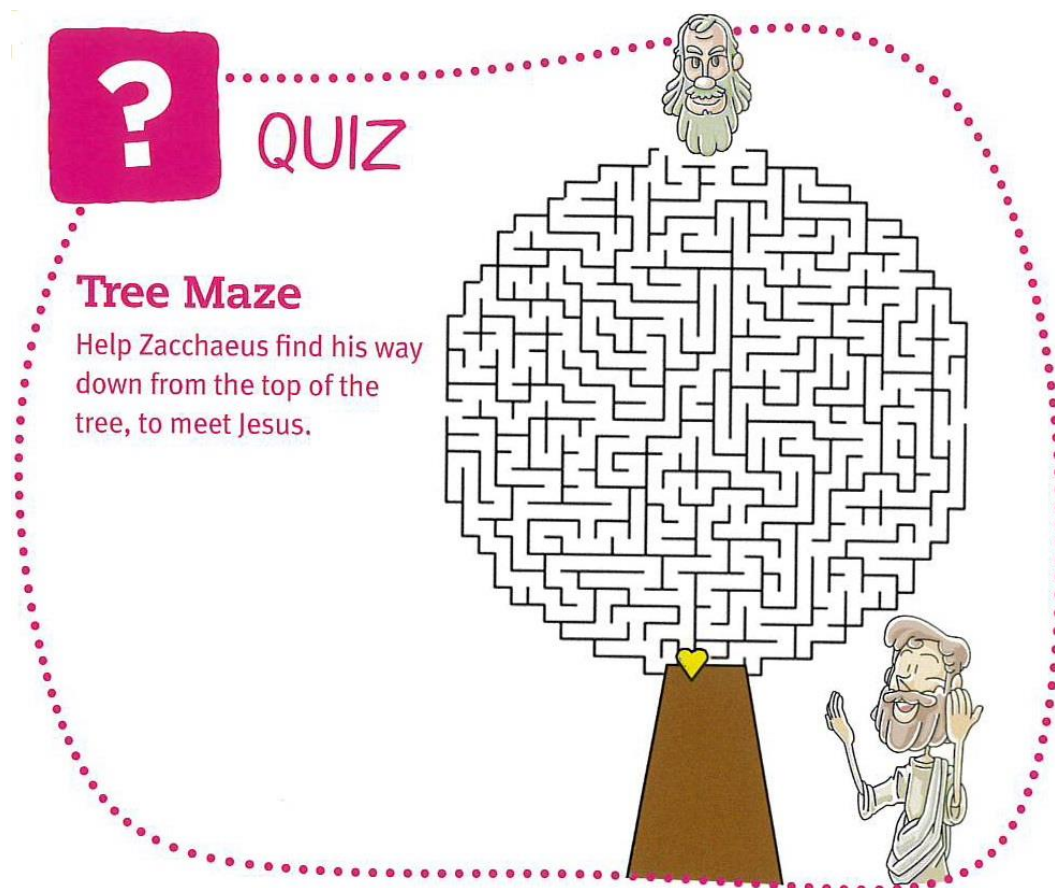
Headlice

There has been a recent case of Head Lice within school. **May we please ask that if your child has long hair it is tied back in school so it may help prevent the spread of head lice.** The following advice comes from the School Nurse: Please check your child/children's and close family members' heads tonight. We also generally recommend that your child/children's head should be checked once a week for head lice. The best way to do this is to wash your child's hair normally, towel dry and then apply plenty of conditioner. You should then brush and comb your child's hair and finally comb thoroughly through with a head lice comb. Current recommended combs are the Bug Buster Kit and Nitty Gritty. The Bug Buster Kit can be ordered from www.nits.net/bugbusting and the Nitty Gritty comb can be bought from local pharmacies.

It is important when using this "wet combing" method that you repeat the above method every four days for two weeks. This should ensure that all live lice, including any which may hatch during this time are removed. Health practitioners do not recommend the use of insecticides.
