Dear Parents,

Watch out if you sit or stand too still at Farway, as you're likely to get measured! Both KS1 and KS2 children were well on their way to becoming measuring masters this week, by demonstrating careful and accurate measuring skills.

Key Stage 1 have been investigating and identifying informal units of measure in their learning, by using objects around the school to measure different dinosaur footprints. Can you remember the important rule when you pick an informal unit to measure? We discovered that you can measure with pretty much anything, but it must always be the same size to make it accurate. The children were very inventive with their selection of informal objects to measure with, including lego bricks, felt pens, rubbers, scissors, glue sticks and even paintbrushes!

Key Stage 1 also got to step inside the footprints of some of the largest dinosaurs to ever roam the land. With a little support, they successfully measured and drew the lengths and widths of a T.Rex and Apatosaurus footprint, before predicting and checking how many of their own feet they could fit inside the lengths, and general footprint areas. Some of the children predicted they might need some more Farway feet inside the dinosaur footprints to completely fill the area, and sure enough they were correct as we had to borrow Key Stage 2 feet too! The children were amazed to see everyone's feet inside the T.Rex footprint, and realise the sheer size of these giants.

Linked to the planets, Key Stage 2 have been identifying and measuring different radius and diameters. This has been quite a challenge for some of the pupils, and I have been most impressed with their ongoing resilience, and resourcefulness, to strive for the spicier challenges each time. Using compasses to measure the circle properties, the children were then able to apply their knowledge of radius and diameter facts, to create their own scaled down solar systems. What would your top tips be for using a compass to create a circle? What is the special rule between the radius and diameter?

On Friday, the Key Stage 2 children took part in a fantastic trip to see a 'Space Dome' in the Branoc Hall, Branscombe. They took part in lots of exciting space themed activities, and visited the mobile planetarium. More about this next week!


