5. Establishing a playground charter or 'golden rules' type list.		
6. Setting up a house point system. We feel that there are several issues with individual reward systems – often it's the same children who get praised, or children who are always 'good' don't understand when they aren't praised all the time. Therefore if we set up 'school teams' that get points throughout the week it would encourage team work and encourage older children to work with the younger ones etc. Can you suggest how the winning team could be rewarded?		

7. For children who are regularly in trouble some schools use a 'report card' system. After each lesson the teacher writes about the behaviour and discusses this with the child – the parents are informed of the outcome at the end of each week.	
8. For serious 'offences' (or continuous poor behaviour not sorted out with the report card system) a letter could be sent home, if three of these are sent in a set period, this would result in a fixed term exclusion. Children would be aware of the seriousness of these letters.	
9. Having responsibilities for older children – e.g. reading partners, playground buddies etc. (Any further ideas for responsibilities would be welcome).
