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Dear Parents,

As yet another busy week races by, we somehow find ourselves arriving at the start of December. The Farway Orchard Aims continue to be ever present in the children's efforts and remain a focus for their attitudes towards their learning.

Fresh from their local postman visit, the children in KS1 have been identifying what is written on an envelope, and when you need to post someone a letter, a card or a parcel. The children have collaborated to create addresses for the various characters of the Jolly Christmas Postman story, and have written them on a range of envelopes for the postman's posting sack.

The children in KS1 also welcomed a new member to their class this week as Humpty Dumpty came in, to tell them all about his unfortunate accident! Using their special question words, the children asked Humpty about his unlucky fall. Can you remember why Humpty fell off the wall? Tell someone at home who helped him first. KS1 have also looked closely at the local Farway area and began to plot the local known landmarks they can see. They correctly identified Farway school and the church on a large scale map. How many deliveries does the Farway postman have to make in this area do you think? Who gets their post first? Who has to wait the longest and why?

In KS2 the children have been creating and editing their own imaginative endings of the Victorian story, 'Fair's Fair', to reveal their own final adventures for Jackson and the monstrous dog. What will Jackson's last journey involve? How will the story conclude?

Geometric reasoning has been the focus in KS2 maths this week, and the children have been using their numeracy vocabulary, to describe different angles and how they can be compared. The pupils have also started to look at protractors and establish the correct method to accurately measure and record the angles of 2D shapes. I have been especially impressed with the resilience and perseverance shown by the pupils in KS2, who have found this unit of maths to be initially quite challenging. Well done for your positive 'I can do it' mind sets. Keep this up!

Also this week, the Farway pupils have started to learn a Christmas play story and songs, for their upcoming performance. Please look out for any story lines or songs coming home, which will help your children learn and remember what they have to say or sing.


In accordance with our policy, if you pay for your child's meals then payments for school meals should be made on the Monday before the meals are taken.
