Nepal

Following the challenge of SATS week, next Friday (15th May) will be the Nepal Fundraising day, organized by Year 6'. It will be a non-uniform day with a suggested donation of at least £1 per child. There will also be a table top sale in the afternoon to raise funds, and I hope you will support them by sending in items for their sale and coming along on the day.

As you know, the children have been very keen to support Nepal following the devastating earthquake. Miss Moss (One of our Branscombe teachers) lived in Nepal for several years and has advised us on how we can get money to those in need:

"INF (the International Nepal Fellowship) is a Christian medical mission working in health and development among some of the poorest people of Nepal. I worked for them for six years between 2000 and 2006 teaching the children of expatriate personnel. This week I have been in touch with friends and former colleagues who have been updating me on the current situation. Being in place within Nepal, INF were in a good position to respond immediately in distributing aid and relief following last weekend's devastating earthquake. They have already sent a medical team to the region at the epicentre of the earthquake (Gorkha) though they quickly ascertained that the primary need is for relief such as food, water and shelter. They are now loading trucks from their base in Pokhara to send food, tents and other essential items to those worst affected. You can find out more on their website (www.inf.org)."

Go Jurassic




