Dear Parents,

Continuing their noticing skills and making links, the children at Farway have been focusing on the learning powers of the owl and spider. By linking their topic work into their literacy, the children have noticed patterns and common themes between the two. KS1 children have been reflecting on their practical learning sessions, by looking back at photographs of their activities and recalling what they learnt and what they know. In Literacy, the children have continued to use colour semantic cards to identify different types of words in their sentence. They have especially enjoyed acting out the nouns, verbs and adverbs from their bread making instructions.

In their topic work, KS1 have been learning a song to help them remember the journey a banana makes from the tree to the shop. After watching a short video showing where bananas come from, the children created their own lyrics and actions to help them recall the banana's journey. Can you remember which country bananas are grown in? Can you explain what happens after they have been cut from the banana tree? The children have been incredibly curious to learn about the journey of other food and notice where in the world it comes from!

KS2 pupils have also continued their reflections this week, by looking through photographs of practical based sessions and making links between their other learning. It has been incredible to see the children reflect with such maturity and detail. They have embedded their knowledge of the Victorians by discussing their understanding and identifying links. The blue, 'good for you' highlighter has never been so well used! The detail and application of technical vocabulary for their Victorian topic has been commended.

I'm sorry I haven't managed to be at Farway this week. Branscombe had its Ofsted inspection on Wednesday and so my plans were somewhat disrupted! A huge thank you to the staff team from across the federation who dropped everything to help and support the Branscombe team! I will see you at Farway on Monday.

Reminder

Honiton Learning Community Sports Events

Throughout this year, we have the opportunity to take part in a selection of sports events at Honiton Community College. We would like our children to take part in as many of these events as possible, as they are a wonderful opportunity for the children to be involved in Physical Education, alongside friends from the Federation and other children in the Learning Community. They are also lots of fun! As the events are often only for a select age range, we would appreciate parent's help in transporting children to and from these activities. This term the events are scheduled to take place on Mondays.

The next event takes place on **Monday 16th October** and is for children in **Years 1 & 2**. If you are able to help transport children to and from this event, please speak to Tamsin in the school office. Any help with this would be gratefully received.

Headlice

There has been a recent case of Head Lice within school. May we please ask that if your child has long hair it is tied back in school so it may help prevent the spread of head lice. The following advice comes from the School Nurse: Please check your child/children's and close family members' heads tonight. We also generally recommend that your child/children's head should be checked once a week for head lice. The best way to do this is to wash your child's hair normally, towel dry and then apply plenty of conditioner. You should then brush and comb your child's hair and finally comb thoroughly through with a head lice comb. Current recommended combs are the Bug Buster Kit and Nitty Gritty. The Bug Buster Kit can be ordered from www.nits.net/bugbusting and the Nitty Gritty comb can be bought from local pharmacies.

It is important when using this "wet combing" method that you repeat the above method every four days for two weeks. This should ensure that all live lice, including any which may hatch during this time are removed. Health practitioners do not recommend the use of insecticides. For further information please contact your school nurse on 01395 576162.

Every child in year's 1-4 should have received an NHS Flu vaccination pack. If you have not already returned these forms, to let us know whether or not you would like your child vaccinated, please can you send them in to Tamsin in the Office ASAP. Spare forms are available from the office, if you need one please let us know. Thank you for your help with this.
