Well, what an eventful week! Even the weather didn't dampen our spirits or motivation as the children sang in the playground, 'Rain, rain, go away!' It certainly hasn't stopped us being superstars at Farway!'

After successfully getting back into school routines so quickly, KS1 have excitedly started their new story writing literacy unit. They have been developing their story language by creating their own memorable actions for key vocabulary in the story of The Little Red Hen. In particular, they have been exploring the power of adjectives to describe their story characters. In maths, the children have been sharing their number knowledge and proving how and why they know something. Maybe when you are out and about at the weekend you can go on a number hunt. What is the biggest number you can find? Don't forget to come and tell us what you noticed!

Diary writing is keeping the pupils in KS2 busy this week. Linked to their Victorian topic, the children are working eagerly towards writing a diary entry in the role of Queen Victoria. They have been immersing themselves in the features of diary writing and the technical vocabulary definitions for the Victorian era. In maths, the children have started to explore place value and use resources to prove their understanding. Some of the children even attempted to construct the thousand number cube. The discussion and mathematical language following this work was incredibly insightful as the children enjoyed the challenge of working with four, five and six digit numbers!

In topic work, all the children have embraced their new themes. KS1 have started to explore 'Food' and where it comes from, while KS2 have begun researching the family tree of Queen Victoria. Why not share your top facts you've learnt in your new topic so far!

#### **Data Collection Sheets**

Data Collection Sheets were sent home this week with every child please could you check all the details on the form are correct so we can contact you in case of an emergency. Please also ensure there is at least one local contact other than parents. Even if all the details are correct the form still needs signing and handing back to Tamsin in the office.

#### **Clothing & Coats**

Please can children bring a coat to school every day? The weather is very changeable at the moment, and we use the outside environment to support our learning - whatever the weather. All clothing also needs to be labelled with names. Thank you for your help with this.

#### Bags

Reading bags with reading books and reading records must be at school every day please. Children read on a daily basis.

#### **Individual School Photographs**

On Friday 22nd September the children will be having their individual school photographs. The photographs will be taken at the very start of the school day, so we would be grateful if you can arrive promptly. We would also appreciate it if the children can come to school, dressed smartly in their full school uniform, including sweatshirt/cardigan with logo. The children may wish to bring a hairbrush to school with them, on this occasion.

## **Outdoor clothing and P.E Kit**

All children need to have appropriate outdoor clothing with them for every Wednesday afternoon. The children also need to have the full P.E kit in school every Monday, consisting of red Farway logo t-shirt, black shorts and trainers. Thank you.

## Headlice

There has been a recent case of Head Lice within school. **May we please ask that if your child has long hair it is tied back in school so it may help prevent the spread of head lice.** The following advice comes from the School Nurse: Please check your child/children's and close family members' heads tonight. We also generally recommend that your child/children's head should be checked once a week for head lice. The best way to do this is to wash your child's hair normally, towel dry and then apply plenty of conditioner. You should then brush and comb your child's hair and finally comb thoroughly through with a head lice comb. Current recommended combs are the Bug Buster Kit and Nitty Gritty. The Bug Buster Kit can be ordered from <u>www.nits.net/bugbusting</u> and the Nitty Gritty comb can be bought from local pharmacies.

It is important when using this "wet combing" method that you repeat the above method every four days for two weeks. This should ensure that all live lice, including any which may hatch during this time are removed. Health practitioners do not recommend the use of insecticides.
