

Dear Parents,

What another busy week at Farway! The children have excelled themselves this week with their collaboration skills and team work especially. From small group work to whole class activities, it's been so wonderful to see everyone so committed to being the best they can be. As one of our year five pupils said this week, 'We might be good by ourselves, but together we are great!'

Key Stage One children have started to draft their information text by writing sentences about plants in small teams, before sorting and classifying them into the relevant sections for an information text. Can you remember why some of the sentences could be grouped together? What could the subheadings be? Explain to someone at home what you think the captions could be for the plant photographs.

In Maths, Key Stage One children have continued to identify fractions of objects and shapes. Armed with only a single piece of A4 paper, their challenge was to investigate how many ways they could fold their piece of paper in half. What was the most interesting way you found? How did you know you'd folded the paper in half? The children collaborated fantastically to use their maths vocabulary to define what half means. One of our reception pupils summed it up beautifully by saying, 'Half is when both sides are the same. They are equal size. A bit like a butterfly!' Why not see what you can halve at home and come and tell us what you found. Some of you could even start to find some quarters or thirds!



Continuing with their biography writing, Key Stage Two have started to research their famous person. From footballers to ballerinas, scientists to world leaders, they've all looked closely to ensure the search criteria for the famous person is adhered to. What have been the challenges for the person you've chosen? What adversities have they overcome? Why was success so far away from them at the start of their career? Explain to someone at home how you feel the person you've chosen meets the selected criteria.

In Maths, Key Stage Two have collaborated to complete their federation 'Paper Towel' challenge that I set them. I have now received all the data to analyse. What a tremendous effort from all of the Key Stage Two pupils this week, in collating their data and drawing their final project conclusions. Explain to someone at home all the different types of maths you have been using in order to complete this project. Real maths, in real world situations is what it's all about. So look out Sir Alan Sugar, there are eight mini project managers after your job!



On Sunday several children, parents and staff from the federation joined together in Exeter for the Exe Valley Challenge. This annual event involves walking a route in the Exe Valley, between Countess Wear and St. David's in teams. Thank you so much to those children and parents who braved the one morning of rain we've had in weeks to take part in this super event. With some rejigging of teams, and borrowing some children belonging to staff, we managed to enter four teams into the different categories – all of which did very well. The rain didn't dampen their spirits at all, and there were huge smiles as they crossed the finish line. Well done to Charlie who represented Farway. A big well done too to Miss Moss who arranged the practice events, sorted the teams and peddled up and down the quay on her bike to find our teams and cheer them on!







Honiton Learning Community Games

On Friday 29th June, our Key Stage 2 children took part in the Honiton Learning Community Games at Honiton Community College. The day was similar to a sports day, with the children taking part in both track and field events. The field events consisted of: howler, long jump, high jump and speed bounce. For the track events the children took part in 50/75m, 200/400m and 300/600m and the day finished with the relay event. The children tried really hard at all of the events, even in the heat, and set a great example for others about positivity and growth mindset. At the end of the day there was a medal ceremony. Ben won a medal for High Jump and Lexi won two medals, for high jump and the 400m. There was also a Spirit of the Games medal for each school which was awarded by staff.
