



Possible Activities

- Count groups of donkeys at the donkey sanctuary in 2s, 3s, 5s, and 10s.
- Solve multiplication and division problems linked to data collected about ourselves, e.g. If there are 6 Y2 children in the class and 12 apples, explain how can we share the apples?
- Solve real life fraction problems, e.g. If half of the donkeys leave the field, how many will be left? How can you prove you know?
- Measure the capacity of water in our drinking bottles and containers and noticing what is the same and what is different about the amounts.

Mathematical Development

(Problem solving, reasoning and numeracy)
Number: Multiplication and Division.
Number: Fractions.
Measurement: Mass, capacity and temperature.

Communication, Language and Literacy

(Speaking and listening, reading, writing, MFL)
Narrative: Writing a story about your birthday.
Poetry: Writing a poem about our favourite things.
Narrative: Retelling a familiar tale.
Instructions: How to dress up as your favourite book character for world book day.
Daily handwriting, spelling, phonics and reading sessions.
Role-play area: linked to homes and family life.

Possible Activities

- Write a non-chronological re about the Donkey Sanctuary charity work.
- Write instructions for Shrove Tuesday and 'How to Make a Pancake'.
- Role-play family life and act out our favourite things we like to do the most.
- Listen to, read and discuss poems linked to the theme and identify poem patterns, e.g. rhyming words and spelling patterns in rhyming words.

Possible Activities

- Guess who is who, from class baby photos and identify how everyone has changed from being a baby, to now.
- Compare a doll to a real baby and identify the potential needs of a human as we grow older and the consequences if these needs are not met.
- Study and compare where you and your family live, go to school and where you worship, with a child who lives somewhere else in the world. This will be linked to our Christian Aid learning project.
- Explore how the donkey sanctuary charity works, where the Donkey Sanctuary locations operate and how and why they rescue donkeys in all parts of the world.

Knowledge and Understanding of the World

(Geography, History, Science)
Science: What humans need for survival, the human life cycle and how have you changed since birth and how you grow.
Geography: A local study of where you and your family live and where you go to school and church. Plus, a comparative study of somewhere else in the world and where other children live and go to school and church - which links with our Christian Aid 'Global Neighbours' learning project.

Physical Development

(PE, Growth and Health)
Indoor PE: Gymnastics.
Outdoor PE: Team games.
Yoga sessions each week.
DPA: Daily Physical Activity sessions outside to wake and shake everyone's bodies and brains up in the morning!

Possible Activities

- Write a guide to keeping fit healthy and being the best version of ourselves.
- Improving balance and stretching skills during yoga sessions.
- Collaborate during team skill with peers.
- Create short gymnastic routines in pairs to perform evaluate.

Possible Activities

- Vision launch activities to introduce our new vision statement across the federation.
- Explore the story and meaning behind Shrove Tuesday, making pancakes and pancake racing.
- Discuss money and how we all need it in our lives and the consequences of not having any, identifying the different values of British coins and notes and thinking about the concept of saving as well as spending.
- Re-think our own goals and aspirations for home and school, including some reflection over any possible changes we might make - considering our new federation vision statement.

Understanding of Faith Belief and Cultures

Creative Development

(Art, D&T, Music, Role Play)
Study famous portrait artists such as Van Gogh, to learn new painting skills and techniques for creating portraits.
Learn and sing songs with an 'All about marvellous me!' theme.
Learn about different rhythms and keeping a steady beat in music, while playing accompaniment instruments.

Possible Activities

- Create portraits of each other, including family members and self portraits, using a variety of art mediums
- Study famous artists such as Van Gogh - who are famously known for portraiture.
- Listen to and play short pieces of music focussing on the rhythm and beat.

ICT Activities

- Learn how to always stay safe online and protect personal data and information during Internet Safety Week.
- Programming and debugging simple computer programs and programmable toys such as Bee-bots.
- Reading, spelling and phonic activities using Bug Club, Bug Club Phonics and Bug Club Spelling and Grammar.
- Learn times tables and number patterns with Times Table Rock Stars.
- Contribute towards establishing and maintaining email communications with other children in other parts of the world, for our 'Global Neighbours' learning project.
