#### Narrative

Investigating the seven story structures. Identify the structures in known stories to use throughout the term in fiction writing

'Where my wellies take me' by Clare and Michael Morpurgo, writing our own version on the local area.

Letters, newspaper report, diary linked to events in the village

#### Poetry

Descriptive poetry on local area. Using local environment for inspiration

#### Narrative

'The Tadpole's Promise.' By Jeanne Willis. Developing own story writing linked with story structures.

### Possible Activities

Exploring living things and their habitats.  
How do animals adapt to their environment?  
Looking at habitats in the school grounds and village.  
Investigate why does a candle get shorter when you burn it?  
Movement of particles expressed as a dance.  
Observe how materials change when they are heated or cooled – cooking activity.  
Compare and group materials looking at materials around the local environment.  
Investigate water cycle.  
Investigate separating material using sieving and filtering. Separate water and silt from the river.  
Studying OS maps of local area.  
Study rivers or coasts and their features.  
Explore local history including linking remembrance with war memorial.  
Investigate local history of buildings/professions/land use.

### Mathematical Development

Explore Numeracy skills through investigation in the classroom and in the outside environment.  
Understanding number by comparing and ordering, mental and written methods to add and subtract, times tables and mental methods to multiply and 2D and 3D shape, all linked with problem solving.
