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Dear Parents,

'All Different, All Equal,' has been the theme for us this week during National Anti-bullying week. Celebrating how different and unique we all are, and what makes us all so special in our own ways, helps us to understand why it's so important that everyone feels able to be themselves, without judgement.

The children took turns to parade their individuality and unique style, by treating us all to a mini catwalk show of their odd socks. It was lovely to hear their reasons for choosing their different socks and seeing the range of vibrant colours and patterns, which naturally reflected their own vibrant and colourful personalities!

Thinking about all the times we might feel sad or unhappy as a result of someone else's hurtful words or actions, we kick started our Monday morning exercises, with the perfectly apt song, 'Shake It Off' to literally 'shake it all off' and start to feel better about ourselves. Team work, trust and collaboration has continued to be the theme for our exercise sessions, where on Wednesday, the children worked in groups of three or six to skip in the middle of a long rope. Some children even attempted to skip with a partner in the middle of the rope. They really enjoyed working together to jump at the same time!

To realise words can be as equally unkind as actions, on Tuesday the children were each given a precious gift. They were given a delicate paper heart to hold in their hands and look after. Sitting in a circle carefully holding their hearts, the children took turns to share something sad, hurtful or unkind someone might have said to them. After hearing each person's unkind words, each child in the circle scrunched a small part of their paper heart. In no time at all the children noticed the paper hearts were nothing more than a scrunched up paper ball.

To understand the power we all have of saying one nice thing to someone and really making someone's day, the children then took turns to share happy, thoughtful, loving and kind things people had said to them. This time as they heard the kinder words being said, the children started to undo a section of their scrunched paper heart. Bit by bit, the children noticed their heart slowly opening out again. But, there was one problem... Can you remember what we could still see on the paper hearts?


The children found that even though they had been able to open their heart out again and flatten it, it wasn't quite the same. The paper was still very creased and little lines remained all over them. They concluded that unkind words really do hurt our hearts, and felt it would be better if we could just all say kinder things to each other, with a kinder voice. They also discussed the 'sorry' word and reflected on it not having magical powers to heal the creased lines in their hearts.

While KS2 pupils continued to debate and reflect on some thought provoking anti bullying issues, such as, 'When does banter turn into bullying?' KS1 children looked at how great it is to be themselves and celebrated all the wonderful things they are good at.

The children have worked very hard during the anti-bullying activities this week, and have shown the Farway Orchard Aims in their conduct, manner and attitudes towards their learning. The activities have reminded the children, about what specifically constitutes bullying, the importance of using the correct language to describe incidents, and how important it is for them to report instances.


Craft Club
