Not a very good one.

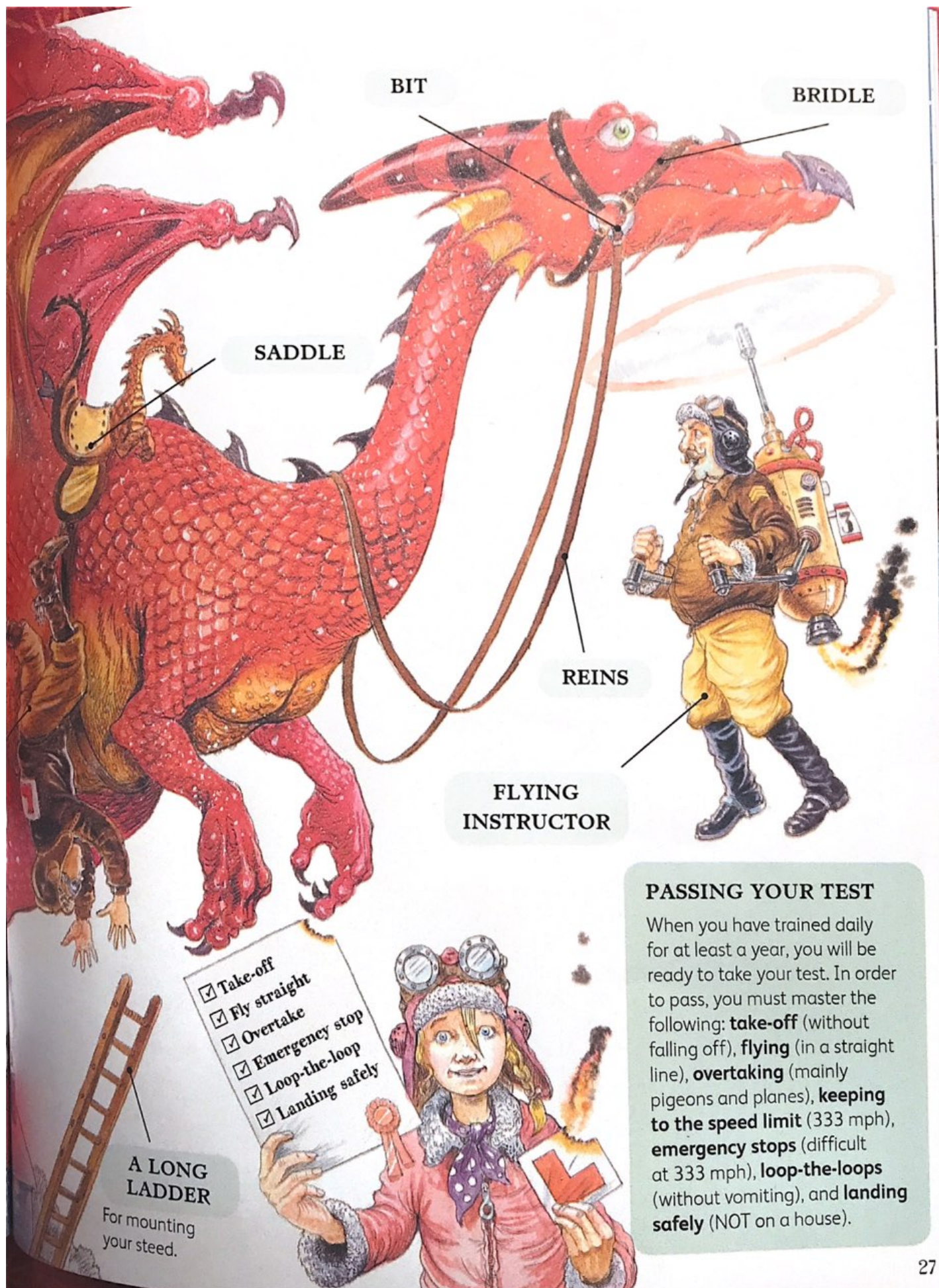
SPURS

PASSING YOUR TEST

When you have trained daily for at least a year, you will be ready to take your test. In order to pass, you must master the following: **take-off** (without falling off), **flying** (in a straight line), **overtaking** (mainly pigeons and planes), **keeping to the speed limit** (333 mph), **emergency stops** (difficult at 333 mph), **loop-the-loops** (without vomiting), and **landing safely** (NOT on a house).
